Order Granting the Debtors' Emergency Motions for Authority to Pay and Honor Prepetition Employee Obligations and Shorten Notice

The matter having come before the Court on the Debtors' Emergency Motions for Authority to Pay and Honor Prepetition Employee Obligations and to Shorten Notice (the "Motion"); and it appearing that the Court has jurisdiction to consider the Motions and the relief requested therein; and the Court finding that due notice of the Motions have been given and that no further notice is required; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The Motions are granted as provided herein.
2. The Debtors are authorized to (a) pay its prepetition wages and benefits to its employees as listed in Exhibit A of the Motion for any prepetition amounts owed in its next pay period (b) reimburse Advance Payroll Services for the 5/5 Payroll (as defined in the Motion), provided, however, that the reimbursement to Advance Payroll Services shall be limited to \$23,000.00, (c) honor any requests for vacation time accrued prepetition, (d) honor any outstanding checks for prepetition wages, and (e) pay its workers' compensation insurance premiums and claims for prepetition insurance as payments become due, and (f) repay any prepetition reimbursable business expenses.
