Chairman Joann Fratianni called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and noted that a quorum was present. There was a motion by Chairman Fratianni, seconded by Commissioner Brennan, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes from the meeting held on June 15, 2017.

As there was no old business, Chairman Fratianni addressed new business. The Chairman opened discussion of the Medical Fee Advisory Board's recommendation for a 30% increase to six E and M codes.

Mr. Rascia advised that the Medical Fee Advisory Board's recommendations for fee schedule reimbursements are limited to access to care. The Medical Fee Advisory Board had voted to increase reimbursement to 130%. Mr. Rascia noted that House Bill 1698 had slashed E and M codes in the past, but that the Medical Fee Advisory Board and the Commission remedied that and left the issue open to revisit rate increases in the future. Mr. Rascia noted that the WCRI report and studies show 126-130% increase in the medicare rate. Mr. Rascia advised that there would be no vote at this meeting. Mr. Rascia asked if live presentation, the WCRI report, or further information was requested by this Board.

Commissioner Brennan advised that he had the transcript and that Dr. Fletcher's and Dr. Wolin's testimony were illustrative of the problems. Commissioner Coppoletti requested underlying data regarding access to care.

Mr. Rascia advised that the Board would get the information and set the vote for the next meeting.

There was a motion by Commissioner Simpson, seconded by Commissioner Luskin, and unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting.
