On September 10, 2020 at 4:00PM, Chairman Michael J. Brennan called the meeting, reconvened from September 4, 2020, to order. Chairman Brennan verified that a quorum was present. Both Employer and Employee Members recommended Nina Mariano and Gina Panepinto and would also have recommended Gerald Napleton, who had already been appointed.

Chairman Brennan asked each caucus if there was any dissent. There was no dissent among the members. Mr. Prince and Ms. Kastner abstained from making any recommendation. Chairman Brennan advised that the Commission would prepare a letter communicating the Board's recommendations to Governor Pritzker.

As to old business, the Chairman advised that arbitrator surveys had been sent out in May and would send board members a memo.

Chairman Brennan noted that there was no public comment.
