## Petitions for Review & Review Motions in Consolidated Cases



When a case is before an arbitrator, and the case is consolidated with one or more other cases, you should only make a filing in the oldest case. However, when the case is on review, the process is different.

When you file a petition for review, you must make the filing in each and every case. This will allow the commission to properly docket each of the cases on review. All of the petitions will be assigned to the same commissioner. The transcript will only be uploaded in the oldest case.

This also applies to other filings at the review level. You must docket each filing in each case individually at the review level. If two cases are consolidated, and both are on review, you would file review motions in each of these cases individually. If two cases are consolidated but only one is on review, and you need to file a motion in the case on review, you would only file the motion in the case that is on review; you do not need to file a motion in the case that is not on review.
